FREE SCHOOL MEALS: ARE YOU MISSING OUT? Every year we have a few children who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) miss out as an application has not been made. Hopefully you have completed a FSM form and are already in the process of finding out if you are eligible. You may not realise that this application needs to be made each academic year your child is in the school. This is particularly important for those children joining the school for the first time. If you qualify for FSM, then the school also qualifies to receive £1,320 additional funding to further enhance the learning experience of your child. #### **DISCO**

The price is £3.50 per child via ParentPay or £4 on the night (please note 'tickets' are not used, instead your child's name will be listed on the door). All Children need to be collected from school at 7.00pm by a responsible adult.

As well as the Disco, where the children can boogie in their best dresses or party pants, there are refreshments for sale and glow sticks to buy.

The children have a wonderful time and grow in confidence with each school Disco. If you have any concerns please speak to your child's class teacher after school, or contact the school office.

Please note, only children that attend Park Hill Junior School are allowed in the Disco and mobile phones are not permitted.

## **NEW TABLET/CONSOLE FOR CHISTMAS?**

#### **ADVERSE WEATHER**

We aim to stay open whatever the weather. However, whenever it snows, there is a decision to make as to whether the school can open and, if so, whether we can operate a normal day. This decision is never taken lightly, and a number of factors are considered:

- Your child's safety
- condition of the roads
- condition of the site
- number of teachers who might be delayed or unable to reach the school due to their journeys.

Central to all of these considerations is the safety of our children and staff and if we felt that we could not operate safely, we would close.

If there is any change to our normal operation, we will text all parents and it will be posted on our website by 7.00am. (It will also be on Opencheck <a href="https://opencheck.atomwide.com/">https://opencheck.atomwide.com/</a>).

In these conditions, there is also the option sometimes to open the school later to ensure that staff and children can get into school safely. If this is the case, once again you will be alerted by text and via the school website by 7am.

### FREE CHILDREN'S E-BOOKS

### **HOLIDAY PLAY SCHEME & PLAY DAYS**

When the school is closed for holidays we operate a holiday play scheme (except Christmas week) between 8am and 6pm. The day is split into sessions of 'free play,' 'structured activities' such as arts and crafts and sports sessions. Children who attend are required to bring a packed lunch. However, children who remain all day are offered a light snack after 4pm. Places are limited and allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

On staff training days the school operates Play Days where children from the Junior School can come to school from 9-3.30pm to play with their friends and participate in fun activities. (children's boxes)/or for a man or a woman (boxes for homeless people).

Christmas cards may also be included in both sets of boxes if you wish.

If you are unable to give a filled box, please donate what items you can or a decorated shoe box. Every donation is greatly appreciated.

All donations should arrive in school by Friday 13<sup>th</sup> December, 3:30pm.
