# New & Improved School Menu

We have now included the Carbon Footprint grading that each dish has.

'A' grade has a low carbon output, ranging to an 'E' grade that is classed as having a high carbon output. We are committed to providing our students with healthy, nutritionally balanced food, but also food that is sustainably produced by our in-house catering team.

78% of our menu has an 'A' grade carbon footprint.
20% of our menu has a 'B' grade carbon footprint.
2% of our menu has a 'C' grade carbon footprint.
With no dish having a 'D' or 'E' grade!
