5. Think of at least 8 questions to ask in an interview of a family member to find out about their personal history. Write down your questions and what you learned about them.

6. Write a diary entry as a new soldier who has joined the army during World War II. Remember to include your thoughts and feelings. What might make you nervous? What might make you excited?

7. Find out the monthly average temperature / rainfall for a country of your choice over a year. Draw a graph of your findings.

8. Design your perfect bedroom. Find out the cost of the various items and calculate the total cost of decoration.

9. Write 20 balancing calculations using a range of operations. i.e. $3 \times 8 = 48 \div 2$

10. Create 10 algebraic expressions which other children can answer. Please provide the answers too.

11. Create a poster to show the different symbols used in scientific drawings of circuits.

12. Create a fact file or slide presentation of one of the key people involved in World War II.

13. Make a list of the different countries involved in WW2 and what side they were on, plus any facts about their involvement in the war.

14. Select your favourite art piece from <https://www.iwm.org.uk/history/10-paintings-of-wartime-london> and recreate it.
