We looked at the trees and learned some of their names and the fruits that they give.








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
### Writing, Geography and History

We learned a lot about the stone age from this book.












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
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### Art and Design and Design and Technology

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
### **Home Learning**


We are blown away by the standard of some of the pieces of Home Learning. Thank you so much for your support with this. We hope that you enjoy doing these activities together.






















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#### Leadership Roles
