#### **This Year's School Priorities**

The School Improvement Plan is drawn up to fully address areas raised by our section 8 inspection (January 2020), and by subsequent school self-evaluation, to ensure that the school makes rapid improvement in moving towards outstanding. The plan is underpinned by aspirational milestones for improvement through our curriculum model and intent, which will result in an upward trajectory in progress for all groups of pupils. Highly effective monitoring and evaluation will enable the school to judge the extent to which it is meeting these milestones.

Addressing Gaps - Address gaps which would have been created by the pandemic and other Adverse Childhood Experiences, to ensure holistic approaches and retrieval practices allow for increased pupil confidence so pupils become resilient learners which in turn will maximise progress for all groups.	<ol> <li>Our catch up strategy &amp; retrieval practices will effectively close gaps in all areas of pupils' learning and well being for all groups.</li> <li>Timely, well planned and executed interventions will maximise pupil progress for all groups.</li> <li>Gaps in basic skills will be addressed especially for children at the cusp. Curriculum Enrichment - As a consequence of the pandemic and pupils accessing our curriculum mostly remotely from their homes for a considerable amount of time; we will need to ensure our curriculum is heavily weighted towards outdoor activities and team building to allow pupils to be curious and gain the knowledge and skills for their future.	<ol> <li>Real life experiences will allow children to develop their curiosity about the world around them.</li> <li>Lessons and learning sessions will be planned so pupils acquire knowledge, remember more and apply skills in and outside of school.</li> <li>Our assessment systems will take cognisance of what pupils have learned as remote learners and the skil pupils excel in, thereby promoting the love of learning in the core and foundation subjects</li> <li>Outside agencies, parents' skills and knowledge will be utilised to develop children's future skills.</li> </ol>
